I. THE NEW YEAR IS A TIME FOR INVENTORY.

As a spiritual inventory is made, accuracy and honesty are critical.

- A. It is critical to be honest with ourselves. Psalm 139:23; Romans 12:3
- B. The psalmist dared to pray, "Cleanse me from these hidden faults" Psalm 19:12
- C. A new year is a good time for taking spiritual inventory of ourselves.

When coupled with the ordinance of the Lord's Supper it is an excellent time!

II. THE NEW YEAR IS A TIME FOR ANALYSIS.

- A. An analysis requires looking realistically at the past, present, and future.
- B. Time becomes an important factor.

Life might be clearer if we knew

the time remaining in life rather than the time lived.

C. We must live with the understanding that
