I. GOD'S PLAN FOR THE CHRISTIAN IS THREE-FOLD

1. Birth – 2. Growth – 3. Maturity

He uses <u>The Scripture</u> – <u>The Church</u> – <u>Other Believers</u> – and <u>Trials</u> to lead us Maturity. The key beloved is that we must follow.

Psalm 23:1-4 Amplified

II. WHY CHRISTIANS HAVE TRIALS?

1 Peter 4:12

- 1. Christians have trials because we live in a sinful world.
 - a. We are part of a fallen race. Romans 3:10-12
 - b. We live in a world of crime, sickness, and death. Hebrews 9:27
- 2. Christians have trials **because of the power of Satan.**
 - a. We have an adversary: Satan

Adversary: An opponent that is on the attack!

- b. Consider Satan's attack on Job.
- c. He is like a roaring lion 1 Peter 5:8
- 3. Christians are on a collision course with the world.
 - a. Jesus warned of this conflict. John 15:18-20
 - b. Many have suffered and died for Christ. Hebrews 11:36-40

III. WHY THE CHRISTIAN'S TRIALS ARE DIFFERENT 1 Peter 4:13

- 1. Christians never suffer alone. Hebrews 13:5b, 6
- 2. Christians become partakers of Christ's sufferings. 1 Peter 4:13
- 3. Christian trials *have a design and purpose*. Romans 8:28, 29
- 4. Christian trials *lead to coming Glory*. Romans 8:17, 18

IV. HOW MATURE CHRISTIANS REACT TO THEIR TRIALS 1 Peter 4:12-14

Be Very Glad, you will be blessed.

- 1. Christians may have *trials concerning their finances*.
 - a. Sometimes we make poor financial decisions.
 - b. Sometimes financial conditions are out of our control.
 - c. Financial trials often teach us to care and to give.
- 2. Christians may have trials concerning their health.

Health trials often teach us to sympathize and pray.

- 3. Christians may have trials concerning their families.
 - a. Even the faithful often suffer in this area.
 - b. These trials often teach us to rejoice in the family of God.
- 4. Christians may have *emotional problems*.

Emotional problems often teach us to lean on Jesus.
