Who Cares If a Person Goes to Hell?

I. GOD THE FATHER CARES

John 3:16, 17

The Father cares and sent His Son.

- a. Bethlehem's stable cries: 'THE FATHER CARES'!
- b. Calvary's cross cries: "THE FATHER CARES"!
- c. The Long wait for Christ's return cries: "THE FATHER CARES"!

II. JESUS THE SON CARES

Luke 19:10

1. See Jesus reaching out to sinners, and you know He cares.

- a. Mingling among sinners, ministering to them. Luke 15:1, 2
- b. Even reaching one more sinner on the cross. Luke 23:39-43
- 2. As He sends His disciples into the world, you know "THE SON CARES"! Matthew 28:18-20

III. THE HOLY SPIRIT CARES

- 1. On the Day of Pentecost, The Holy Spirit indwelt believers.
 - a. Empowering them to witness
 - b. He still speaks through Christians to reach the lost.
- 2. The Holy Spirit is the Lord of the Harvest.
 - a. Bringing conviction to sinners.
 - b. Revealing Christ to the repentant heart.
 - c. Regenerating those who trust in Christ. **Titus 3:4-7**

IV. HEAVEN CARES

- 1. There is Joy in heaven over one sinner who repents. Luke 15:10
- 2. Every time a sinner receives Christ, heaven rings with songs of praise.

3. Think of it!

Every time we lead a person to Christ and they Receive Him, we bring joy to heaven!

B. Far too few Bible Studies and Sermons focus on the realities of this text.
