1. <u>The Purpose of The Call</u>

- A. Teaches us to know ourselves.
- B. We discover our hidden sins.
- C. The Holy Spirit can convict us and lead us to true repentance.

John 8:31, 32

- 2. <u>Neglecting the Call is Damaging and Self-Destructive</u>.
 - A. Hardens the heart.
 - Feeds the attitudes of self-reliance and self-justification.
 - B. Leads to our unwillingness to judge ourselves.
 - While at the same time we readily judge others.
- 3. <u>Self-Reflection Demands Diligence</u>.

Self-Examination is critical because:

it will show us what we don't know about ourselves.

4. Self-Reflection leads to Repentance

Lamentations 3:40b; Zechariah 1:3

Sin is an aversion and turning away from God; repentance is a returning to Him.

A BRIEF SELF-EXAM Lamentations 3:40a

A. <u>What is your attitude concerning sin</u>? Hebrews 12:1, 2
 How do you deal with sin?
 When God convicts you of your sinfulness, how do you respond?

B. Are you saved? 1 John 5:11-13

Only God and you know if you are saved. Are you sure?

- C. <u>Do you desire to live a fully restored life in Jesus</u>? **Philippians 4:13** Thank God that we can confess our sins to Him, and <u>He forgives us of all unrighteousness</u>. **1 John 1:8-10**
- D. <u>Are you willing to work with other Christians</u>? 2 Corinthians 13:11
 We need to rejoice, strive for full restoration, encourage one another, be of 1 mind, and live in peace. This is how we are to live together.

Conclusion: Paul ends his second letter to the Corinthians with a final greeting. **2 Corinthians 13: 14**
